they can make friends from all over the country, set goals and strive to achieve them, create memories, enjoy the great outdoors and escape technology. We want them to have a home away from home.

During Colin's first summer he wrote this to his grandmother, Mimi, "I shot a rifle today. You would think it is fun, but it's not. Love, Colin" His second summer, he earned the EXPERT rank in riflery! He also attempted sailing during his second summer, and it didn't go well. He became scared. As we were talking about his goals for this summer, I asked about sailing and power boating (USPB). He said no, he couldn't. He was still scared and didn't feel like he could overcome it. We discussed the importance of perseverance with a reminder of his Mimi note. Guess what happened?

7/24/23

It's now the 2nd week! It feels like I've been here for weeks. But I'm having fun. This afternoon I'm going to get my sunfish skipper. I'm shill going for my USPB.

17/20/23

I got my sunfish skipper, and I'm not really afraid anymore. I'm going to start my outboard skipper class then I should have my USPB by the end of the 3rd week. I'm having a lot of fun. 7/31/23

Its crozy the 3rd week! Today I am starting VSPB! I'm really excited. If I pass I can drive all boats up to 65Ft in length. Also sailings not scary anymore and I'm having fun doing It. 8/7/23

Three more days! I hope you all had a fun time without me. I'm having fun powerboarting with my USPB and sailing with friends.

The goal for Bailey was to stay all four weeks (seriously.) The drop off was rough with so many tears. **Bailey did it!** She experienced all four weeks. She focused on having fun – enjoyed fishing the most – and made lots of friends. I learned all this **at pick up** because her notes home didn't say anything about having fun, friends or fishing. My heart swelled with love, pride and gratitude because of their accomplishments. **Sending our kids to camp is an investment in who they are, who they will become and in their future.**

In reflecting on this past summer at YMCA Blue Ridge – It was extraordinary!

Each week, I greeted those returning to the Mountain by saying **WELCOME HOME!** For first timers, I shared our wish that each time they passed through the gate, they would want to roll down their windows to smell the fresh mountain air; they would feel the burdens the world places on them sluff off and they would feel like this is a home away from home. The campus was organized chaos with kids, teens, adults and families. Parents felt safe letting their kids run and explore the creeks and trails. Teens met other teenagers from different cities, states and regions; barriers and stereotypes were broken as they realized they have more in common with each other than differences. Caring adults shepherded conversations focused

on leadership, character and values. Young people learned empathy, responsibility, accountability, and how it feels to belong. **EVERYONE had an opportunity to unplug from technology and sit in a rocking chair talking with a new friend or catching up with an old one.** The days were filled with laughter, fun, growth and discovery.

Experiences like these are an investment. When parents send their teenagers to YMCA Blue Ridge, it is an investment. When families choose YMCA Blue Ridge, it is an investment in who they are, who they will become and in their future. We know this and are committed to the work.



YMCA World Urban Network

YMCA Blue Ridge had the honor of hosting the World Urban Network for its 2023 CEO & Leadership Conference. In the 45 years that the World Urban Network has held this conference, this year marked only the fifth time it has taken place in the United States.

The YMCA World Urban Network includes YMCA General Secretaries/ Chief Executives and senior leadership from cities around the world who are committed to advancing the Y's mission, leadership development and international collegiality.

The conference was a tremendous success, strengthening current partnerships and establishing new ones. **80 YMCA professionals from 25 countries around the world** attended informative workshops and engaged in meaningful conversations about their work. They discussed international causes and areas of need along with strategies for how the Y movement around the world can work to address them.

> Among the events was the dedication of two "Peace Poles" which were erected on the east side of Eureka Hall, near the location where the "Eureka Tree" climbed by Blue Ridge founder W.D. Weatherford once stood. Inscribed with the phrase "May Peace Prevail on Earth" in 16 languages, these Peace Poles represent the worldwide movement for peace. The ceremony highlighted the work being done by the gathered YMCA professionals around the world.

> > Since its founding, YMCA Blue Ridge Assembly has brought young people from different backgrounds and cultures together to learn from each other, grow their talents and tackle important issues of the day. These two Peace Poles now stand in this historic place to serve as a reminder of humanity's hope for a future filled with compassion, empathy, understanding and unity.

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BUILDING A BRIGHTER FUTURE

Investing in Young Leaders

When teens come to YMCA Blue Ridge Assembly, they have character-building, positive experiences that shape their future. At the **Y Achievers Summit**, teens attend life skills workshops, engage in group initiatives and learn about college and career paths. **Blue Ridge Leaders' School** emphasizes personal leadership development and take-home application to the home YMCA. Leaders take courses on topics ranging from aquatics to financial development, all designed to foster their leadership, character and health.

We also partner with a variety of other youth-serving organizations to hold teen conferences and camps. The **Cadet Leadership Course**, a program of the Air Force JROTC, brought cadets for the third summer. Over 100 cadets improved social skills, confidence, attention to detail and discipline by participating in the Assembly's archery and Odyssey Challenge Course programs. Buncombe County Rescue taught cadets land navigation, self-aid and survival, while leadership scenarios provided by NC A&T taught the value of strong decision-making skills.

The Fellowship of Christian Athletes brought its Boys and Girls Multi–Sports Camps as well as its Coaches Camp and Leadership Camp to Blue Ridge once again. FCA Leadership learned how to engage emotionally with teammates, grow in their faith and transform their communities as leaders. Coaches Camp attendees likewise became "engaged, equipped and empowered" to serve their teams and communities while passing along the message of Christ. This year's theme, "GREATER," encouraged teen athletes and coaches alike to seek greater purpose beyond trophies and praise – to become GREATER in Jesus Christ as written in John 3:30: "He must increase, but I must decrease."

> Summer is also when Blue Ridge is actively shepherding leaders of our own. Our 80 summer employees gained valuable hands-on experience that will empower them to enter the workforce with confidence. This program exemplifies YMCA Blue Ridge's founding principles, teaching the next generation there is dignity in labor and anything that ministers to human need is a God-given responsibility.
